## The Lord Lieutenant's Answer.

## Gentlemen.

I shall be fure to reprefent to His Majesty your du tiful Behaviour and Resolution to do all in your Power to make his Reign easy and glorious, and with what Unanimity you have given the Supply, and dispatched the publick Bussiness; and you may affuredy hope from His Majefty's Goodnefs, a gra-cigus Acceptance of those Instances of Duty and Zeal for his Scrvice.

Naples, 08. 27. To-Morrow will fail from Baiæ for Messina 500 Recruits, and we are expetting Imbarkations from Genoa for about 3000 Imperial Horle, which are also defigned for Sicily.

Paris, Nov. 15. M. Penterridter the Emperour's Minister, arrived here on the 9th Instant, and Yesterday had his first Audience of the Regent. Letters from the Camp before Roles of the 28th paft advile, that the Veffels expected from the Coaft of France being arrived in the Bay of Roles, the Artillery they had brought for the Siege was difimbarking and bringing to the Camp, and that Dispositions were making for opening the Trenches. We have an Account from Spain, that Collonel Cotton, Governour of Gibraltar, having In-telligence given him by one of his Correlpondents on that Part of the Coaft, of the Station in which a large Privateer fitted out by the Captain General of Malaga lay cruifing, communicated it to Captain Delgarno of the Sheernels Man of War which happened to touch at Gibraltar, and the Captain going without Loss of Time in Quest of her, met with and destroyed her. The Weather has been fo Hormy fince the 4th Inftant upon the Coaft of Brittany; that no Ship could come near it; lo that they have no manner of Intelligence on that Side what is become of the Spanish Ships which came from St. Andero. The Officers that landed near Vannes and went a little up the Country, brought a confiderable Sum of Money afhore with them, and lodged it at a Gentleman's Houle ; which having been dil covered by a Seaman who was accidentally employed to help to carry it, has fince been

deized by the King's Officers. Whitehall, Nov. 9. This Morning arrived Major Roberts, being fent by the Lord Vifcount Cobham, with the following Account.

On the 12th of Offobet his Lordfhip de-tached General Wade with 1000 Men, who imbarking on four Transports, with a Bomb-Vessel, went up to Ponte Vedra, which they entered without any Opposition, though the Garrilon which marched out of Vigo was there, with some other Forces, making together 13 Companies; but on his Approach they aban doned the Place, taking with them the princi-pal Inhabitants. The Atlenal there, in which pal Inhabitante. were Barracks for 2000 Men, as also 5000 Imall Arms, near 300 Barrels of Powder, and Abundance of other Stores, was burnt;

and Fort Marine, about four Miles from thence, was blown up: At Ponte Vedra and at that Fort two Brafs Cannon of 42 Pound Ball, four 24 Pounders, and feven others, with three Brafs Mortars, were taken and fent down to Vigo, and 86 Iron Cannon were nailed and spoiled On the 24th General Wade returned to Vigo. During this time, all the Iron Guns found at Vigo were nailed, and their Tronions were broken off, and the Carriages burnt. Likewife the Brals Ordnance abovementioned, with thole found in the Cafile of Vigo and other Stores of Arms and Ammunition, were put on board the Transports. On the 25th the great Ciftern in the Caffle of Vigo was blown up : That Day and the next the Forces were all imbarked. On the 27th the Fleet pet to Sea, in order to return to Spithead, the Place appointed for their Rendezvous. Major Roberts being ordered to go on board the Speedwell Bomb Veffel, whole Mortars were taken out, and to make the best of his Way before for England, left the Fleet on the 29th in the 43d Degree of Latitude, and landed at Portfmouth laft Night. They had Advice at Vigo, that the Bomb Veffel, which in tempestuous Weather had been separated from the Fleet off the Groyne, had got lafe into Lisbon.
